

**Postdoctoral Position
Hoglund Brain Imaging Center/
Kansas City Center for Anxiety Treatment**

The Hoglund Brain Imaging Center (HBIC: www.kumc.edu/hoglund) invites applications for a two-year postdoctoral fellowship in anxiety disorders clinical research. The fellow will assume primary responsibility for the coordination of neuroimaging studies in conjunction with the Kansas City Center for Anxiety Treatment (KCCAT: www.kcanxiety.com), a research and educational affiliate of HBIC/KUMC specializing in state-of-the-art cognitive-behavioral treatments for all ages. HBIC is a stand-alone facility within the University of Kansas Medical Center. Imaging modalities include Magnetic Resonance Imaging/Spectroscopy (3 Tesla Siemens human and 9.4 Tesla Varian animal) and Magnetoencephalography (151 channel cortical and 83 channel fetal) systems as well as strong computational support for cross-modality integration. Excellent opportunities exist for collaborative and independent research in basic and applied neuroscience. HBIC houses a multidisciplinary group of researchers with a wide variety of interests spanning anxiety disorders, addiction/impulse control disorders, brain aging, neurodegenerative diseases, neurological diseases, and brain injury as well as normal brain function. Kansas City is a beautiful and rapidly growing metropolitan area of 2 million.

Minimum qualifications for this position include a doctoral degree in Clinical Psychology or Cognitive Neuroscience or a related area. Previous neuroimaging experience is helpful but not required. Training in neuropsychology and cognitive-behavioral theories/interventions for anxiety disorders is also preferred. Activities and clinical supervision meeting the requirements for licensure in the state of Kansas will be provided as applicable.
